Dr. Russel recommended a peer weew committee of medical and public health experts. His advicecorresponded losely with Harvey lood's own innovations in the use of successful management committees instead traditional herarchical structures nlestablishing the committee, Mr. Hood also created a members protation system, which continues to day, designed to profit from members' expertise without overtaxing them, and to ensure that the Foundation would continue to draw upon New England's eading child heath experts.
